## President of Latvia Egils Levits congratulates diaspora on Proclamation Day

Dear Latvians around the world,

102 years ago, on 18 November, the day when the Republic of Latvia was proclaimed, the outstanding Latvian statesman Foreign Minister Zigfrīds Meierovics was in London.

He had just signed a brief letter to Kārlis Pētersons (Charles Peterson), a Latvian immigrant and producer of the famous Peterson Pipes of Dublin. In his letter Mr Meierovics asks for an audience and an opportunity to discuss possible assistance in matters crucial for Latvia.

This shows that cooperation between Latvia and Latvians living abroad began as early as the republic itself.

Many of you have most probably been forced to postpone your plans to visit Latvia for this year's 18 November celebrations or Christmas. Although the single-farmstead mentality is deeply embedded in every Latvian, the digital age requires global Latvians to create 'global villages'.
